

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

# How the Task Force Happened

- Community Advocacy Works!
  - Policy Breakfast for elected officials, Dec. 1, 2014
- Community challenged elected leaders to "Take leadership" and "Form a Task Force"
- Unanimous resolution creating Task Force passed 2 weeks later: 14 appointed members

# The Strategy to End AIDS in Fulton, County Methodology

- 5 Committees: Prevention and Care, Data, Social Determinants, Policy, Executive
- Over 120 active contributors over 2.5 years
  - PLWH, care providers, CBOs, academia, government
- Community Engagement
  - Community listening sessions & stakeholder meetings across county
  - Topic-driven intensive Face-to-Face Meetings
  - Frequent committee conference calls

# Three Reports: 10 Key Priorities

- Stigma Kills. Don't Tolerate It.
- Create Client-Centered Care and Services
- Decrease Barriers to Care Engagement (Rapid Entry!)
- Improve Targeted HIV Testing
- HIV Is Preventable. Prevent It. (PrEP, PEP, syringe services, U=U)

- No More Babies Born with HIV.
- Education is HIV Prevention.
- Housing is HIV Prevention and Treatment.
- Mental Health & Substance Use Services are Care, Too.
- Create Policies that Promote Health.

# Challenges and Renewed Commitment

- County disbanded Task Force 7/31/17; created permanent Advisory Committee
- Challenges:
  - Waning political will lost 2 key political leaders!
  - Lack of HIV leadership
  - Fragmentation became more fragmented
- New Advisory Committee finally met 10/19/18



## DC Appleseed – State of HIV Response in DC



## 90/90/50 Key Strategies

90% HIV Positive Persons Know Status



90% Diagnosed on Treatment



90% on Treatment Virally Suppressed



50% Reduction in New Diagnoses

- Focused geospatial & demographic testing
- Regional data sharing
- Improve testing capacity & performance

- Reduce linkage to 30 days
- Rapid ART
- Data to Care
- Culturally affirming services
- Social determinants

- Engage providers
- Pharmacies & PBMs on treatment adherence
- Data to Care
- Increase support services, behavioral health, housing & economic opportunity

- Expand PrEP/PEP
- Reduce stigma
- Accelerated response on new diagnoses

- Youth education, access to services

Goal #3: 90% of District residents living with HIV in treatment achieve viral suppression	78%	82%	84%	90%
Goal #4: 50% reduction in new HIV diagnoses	401	369	368	196
