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# Project Consumer-LINC: <u>Linking Individuals into</u> <u>Needed Care</u>

- To describe at least two PLWH volunteer-based strategies for linking PLWH into care

## **Volunteer Roles for Consumers: Refining the System of Care**

Approach: work within planning bodies to change the system of care — remove barriers, improve access

#### Examples:

- Identify barriers keeping particular PLWH groups out of care
- Change Standards of Care
- Use directives to refine service models



### **Volunteer Roles for Consumer Committees & Caucuses**

#### Approaches:

- Involve members of PLWH Committee or Caucus
- Provide training and leadership roles in education and outreach

#### Examples:

- Spearhead PLWH Forums/Conferences that attract PLWH not in care
- Do outreach to publicize availability of care in hard-to-reach communities
- Participate in outreach/testing teams (help address HIV+/unaware priority)

### **Volunteer/Stipended Roles for Consumers**

- Approach: PLWH caucus serves as program operator within a prioritized service category (e.g., Outreach, Health Education & Risk Reduction, Referral for Health Care/ Supportive Services)
- Example: PLWH caucus does outreach or testing and linkage to care, working on a volunteer or stipend basis
