Purpose of Monitoring

- Required by HRSA to ensure compliance with statutory requirements, regulations and guidance
- Review and test compliance with applicable laws, regulations and policies
- Assess efficiency of operations and effectiveness in achieving program results
- Makes recommendations to enhance agency operations, promote economy, efficiency and compliance with Federal and programmatic
 requirements



Legislative Background


The uniform grants rules, codified at 2 CFR Part 200, clarify the role of the grantee with regard to monitoring and reporting program performance (2 CFR Part 200.328) and sub-recipient monitoring and management (2 CFR Part 200.331). "The non-Federal entity is responsible for oversight of the operations of the Federal award supported activities". The non-Federal entity must monitor its activities under Federal awards to assure compliance with applicable Federal requirements and performance expectations are being achieved. Monitoring by the non-Federal entity must cover each program, function or activity. See also 2 CFR Part 200.331 for subrecipient monitoring requirements.





National Monitoring Standards

- Developed by HRSA/HAB to provide clear guidance to recipients regarding monitoring expectations of recipients and subrecipients
- Define fiscal and program criteria to be monitored for compliance







Monitoring of Subrecipients

- Recipients are required to conduct <u>annual site visits</u> to subrecipients
 - Include fiduciary agents, MOAs and MOUs
 - Partnership with other RWHAP Parts
 - Exception: Recipients with an approved Site Visit Exemption
- Monitor process used to reinforce mutual obligations between funder and provider
- Site Visit Team:
 - Fiscal
 - Administrative/Programmatic
 - Clinical Quality Management





Subrecipient Site Visit

- Policies and Procedures
 - Monitoring manual
- Develop a schedule
- Site Visit Tools
 - Administrative, Program, and Fiscal
 - Reviewed and updated as needed
 - Report of findings and recommendations
 - Follow-up Process
