The Special Projects of National Significance (SPNS) Program, the research and development (R&D) arm within the HRSA HIV/AIDS Bureau (HAB), supports the development of innovative models of HIV care and treatment and provides resources to support their replication.

Through its demonstration projects, SPNS evaluates the design, implementation, utilization, cost, and health-related outcomes of care and treatment models. SPNS also promotes the dissemination and replication of successful interventions.

IHIP resources include recommendations for replicating the evidence-informed interventions on a budget and integrating them into existing health systems.



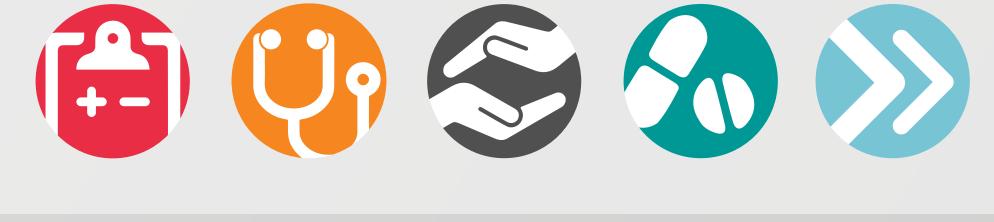

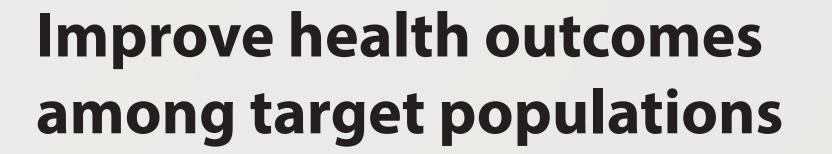

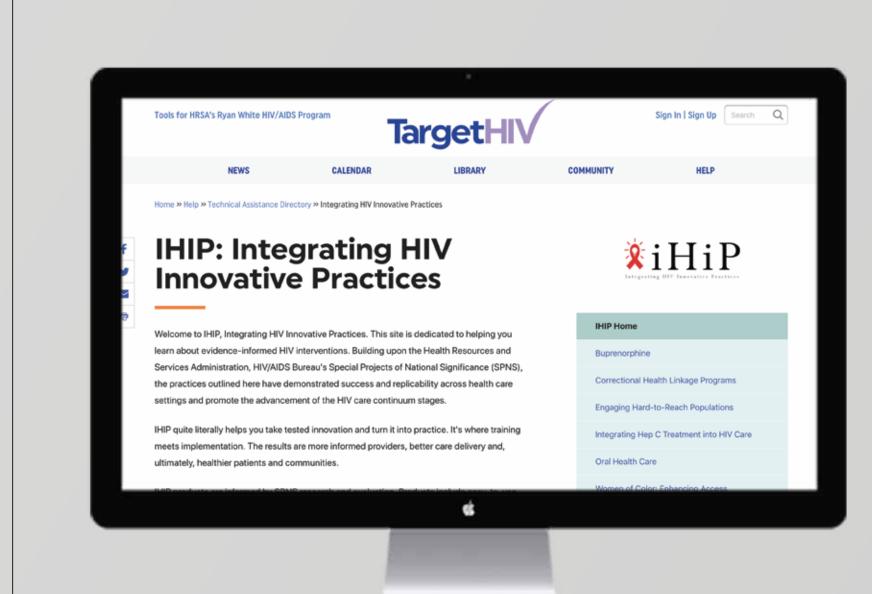
