








Programmatic Goals



Part A programmatic needs/desires were defined:

- Priority Audience: Young adults 18 to 30 with HIV, in and out of care.
- Ryan White (RW) provides high-quality, compassionate HIV care and support services.
- RW offers free or low-cost care, and navigation to other resources.
- Promote Undetectable=Untransmittable.

Goals

- Promote RW services and motivate young PWH (and other PWH) to apply.
- Call to Action: APPLY NOW to see what free or low-cost programs/services you qualify for.

What Young PWH Shared...



- How they learned they had HIV, feeling alone with their diagnosis, or the support they had from friends, relatives and chosen family.
- Stories of stigma and discrimination when disclosing their status.
- How Ryan White care and supported services impacted their outlook.
- Being supported and informed made their diagnosis easier to manage.
- Accepting their HIV status resulted in them feeling powerful and courageous—a greater version of themselves!

What Young PWH Shared cont.




- Peer to peer connection and rapport is key to engaging young people.
- Most often, they used a smart phone to access the internet.
- Social media and networking preferences.
- Ensure there is diverse representation, and language considerations.
- No HIV clichés: "People know what a red ribbon means."
- "Don't make me scroll!"






