DPD's Mission







Technical Expert Panels (TEPs)

- Bring together experts to discuss specific questions HRSA wants to learn more about to inform program planning
- Two-day TEP in August 2023
 - Purpose: Better understand RWHAP recipients' efforts towards streamlining eligibility determination and confirmation
 - Examined current processes and systems
 - Explored data centralization and integration
 - Assessed the administrative, technical, and policy-related barriers and facilitators in determining client eligibility and reducing client and administrative burden while enhancing the customer experience



Diagnosing and Linking People with HIV to Effective Care is Critical for Preventing New Transmissions

HIV Transmissions in the United States, 2016

% of People with HIV	Status of Care	Accounted for X% of New Transmissions ^a
15%	Didn't know they had HIV	38%
23%	Knew they had HIV but weren't in care	43%
11%	In care but not virally suppressed	20%
51%	Taking HIV medicine and virally suppressed	0%




