Overview



Supports more than 90 programs that provide health care to people who are geographically isolated, economically or medically challenged



HRSA does this through grants and cooperative agreements to more than 3,000 awardees, including community and faith-based organizations, colleges and universities, hospitals, state, local, and tribal governments, and private entities



Every year, HRSA programs serve tens of millions of people, including people with HIV/AIDS, pregnant people, mothers and their families, and those otherwise unable to access quality health care

HRSA's HIV/AIDS Bureau Vision and Mission

Vision

Optimal HIV care and treatment for all to end the HIV epidemic in the U.S.

Mission

Provide leadership and resources to advance HIV care and treatment to improve health outcomes and reduce health disparities for people with HIV and affected communities.



HRSA's Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program (RWHAP) Overview

- Provides a comprehensive system of HIV primary medical care, medications, and essential support services for low-income people with HIV.
- Funds grants to states, cities, counties, and local community-based organizations to improve health outcomes and reduce HIV transmission.
 - Recipients determine service delivery and funding priorities based on local needs and planning process.
- Provided services to nearly 562,000 people in 2020—more than half of all people with diagnosed HIV in the United States.
- 89.4% of RWHAP clients receiving HIV medical care were virally suppressed in 2020, exceeding national average of 64.6%ⁱ.

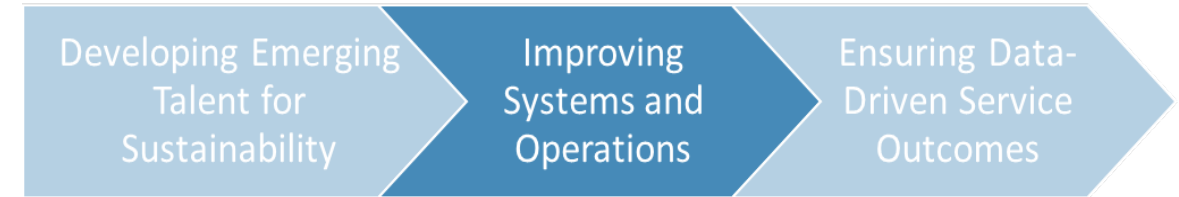

EHE Mentorship program

Building Resource Networks

- TA Leads: Darion Banister and Nicole Holmes
- Jurisdictions: Dallas County (TX), Essex County (NJ), San Bernadino Co (CA), Arkansas
- Development of a resource network through a community mapping process and partnering with non-traditional partners (i.e., Faith-based entities)
- Priorities focus on access to community based supportive services outside of patient-care

TA Case Study- Florida

TA Request: To increase coordination between EHE stakeholders (data-sharing).

TA Activities

- Collaboration with Georgetown University SPNS project on establishing data-sharing agreements (DSAs) between state health departments and Part As in Florida, Louisiana and Alabama.
- NASTAD SCP participates in monthly Part A/Georgetown University, Florida Department of Health (FDOH) at Tallahassee and HRSA 19-039 site visits.
- The DSA developed by Georgetown University to share data between the state health department and six Florida Part As was approved and is being reviewed by respective legal teams.
- NASTAD will support jurisdictions with implementation once DSAs are fully executed between FL DOH and Part As.

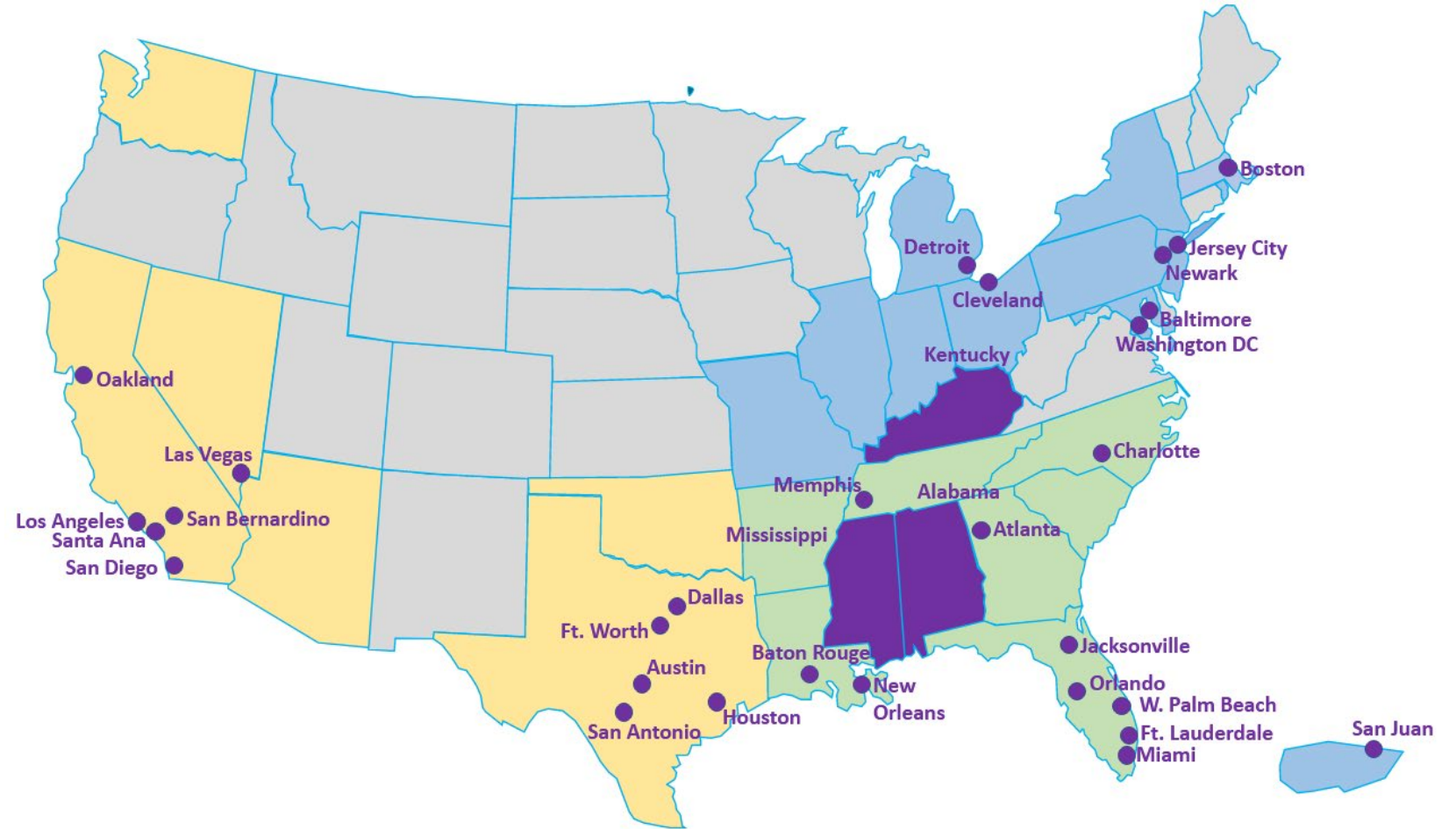

Pair jurisdictions with TAP-in Coach who anchors TA activities



Identify underlying factors at the environmental, jurisdiction, provider, individual, and consumer level



Develop agreed upon TA goals, objectives, and outcomes with jurisdiction



Explore buy-in of leadership, staff, partner, and very importantly community



Conduct pro-active, regularly scheduled TA sessions



Identify and connect jurisdictions with local assets

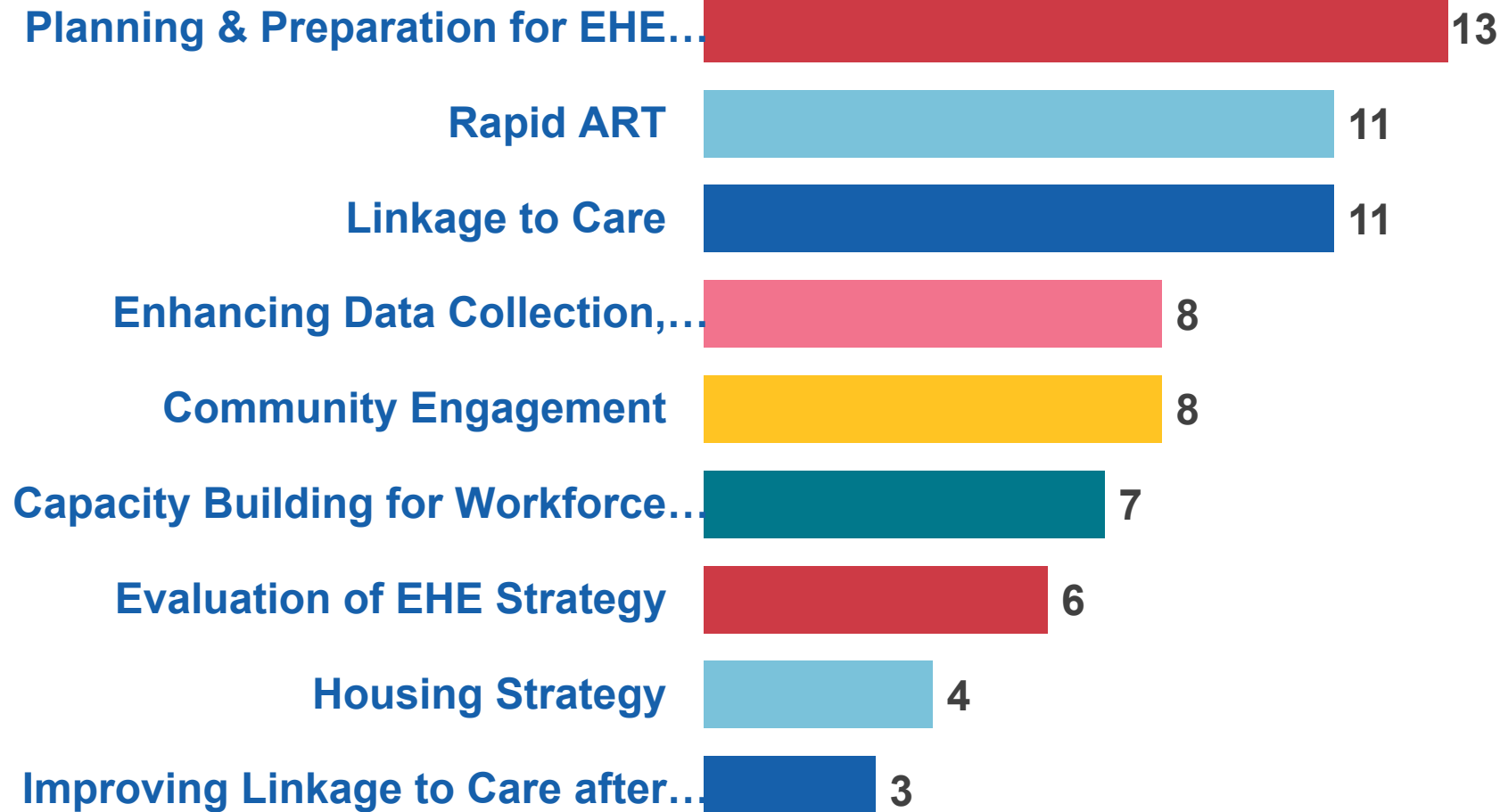


Continuously measure/monitor progress to meet outcomes

Housing

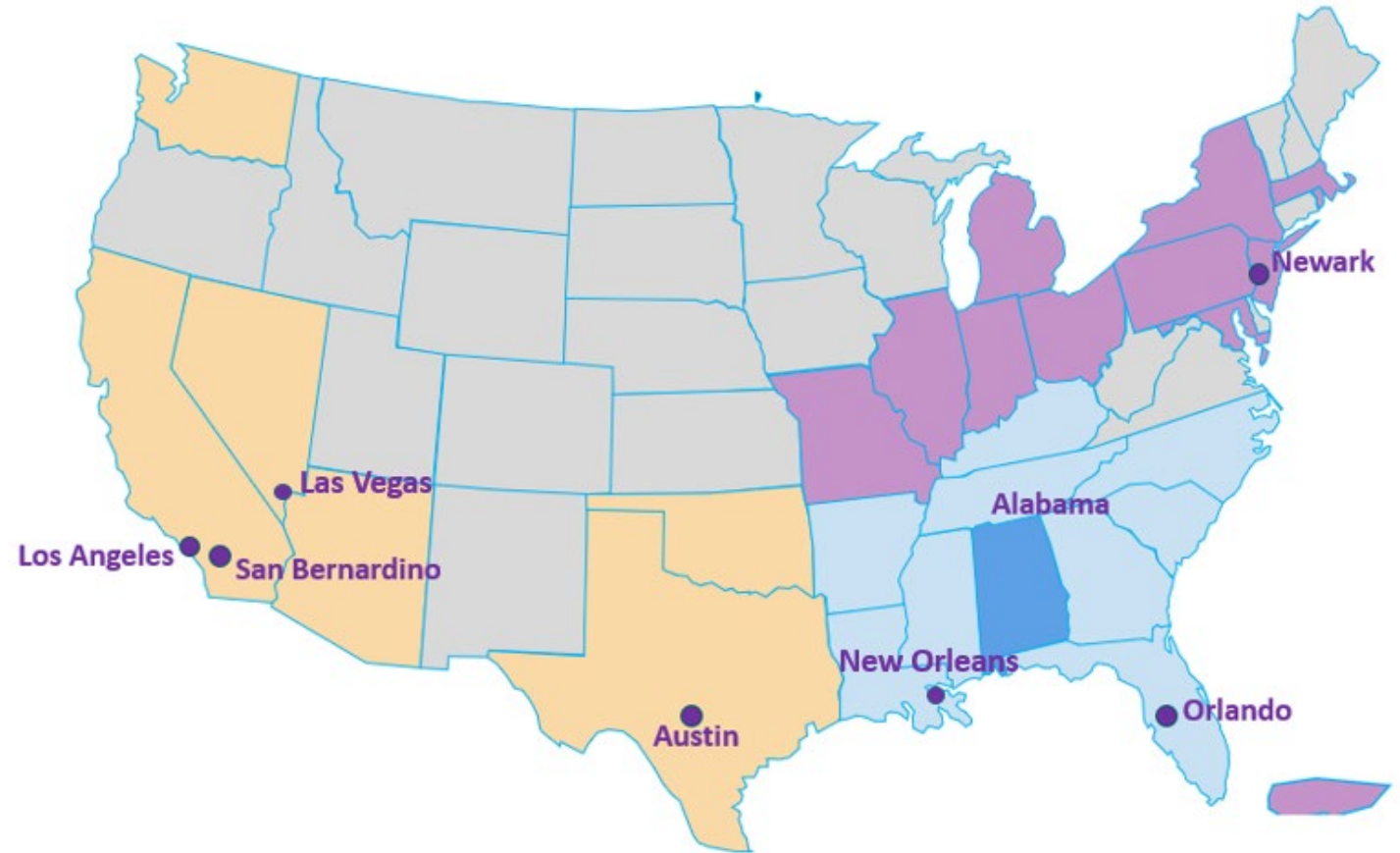
- Housing guidelines developed

- Build shared understanding of system, gaps, opportunities

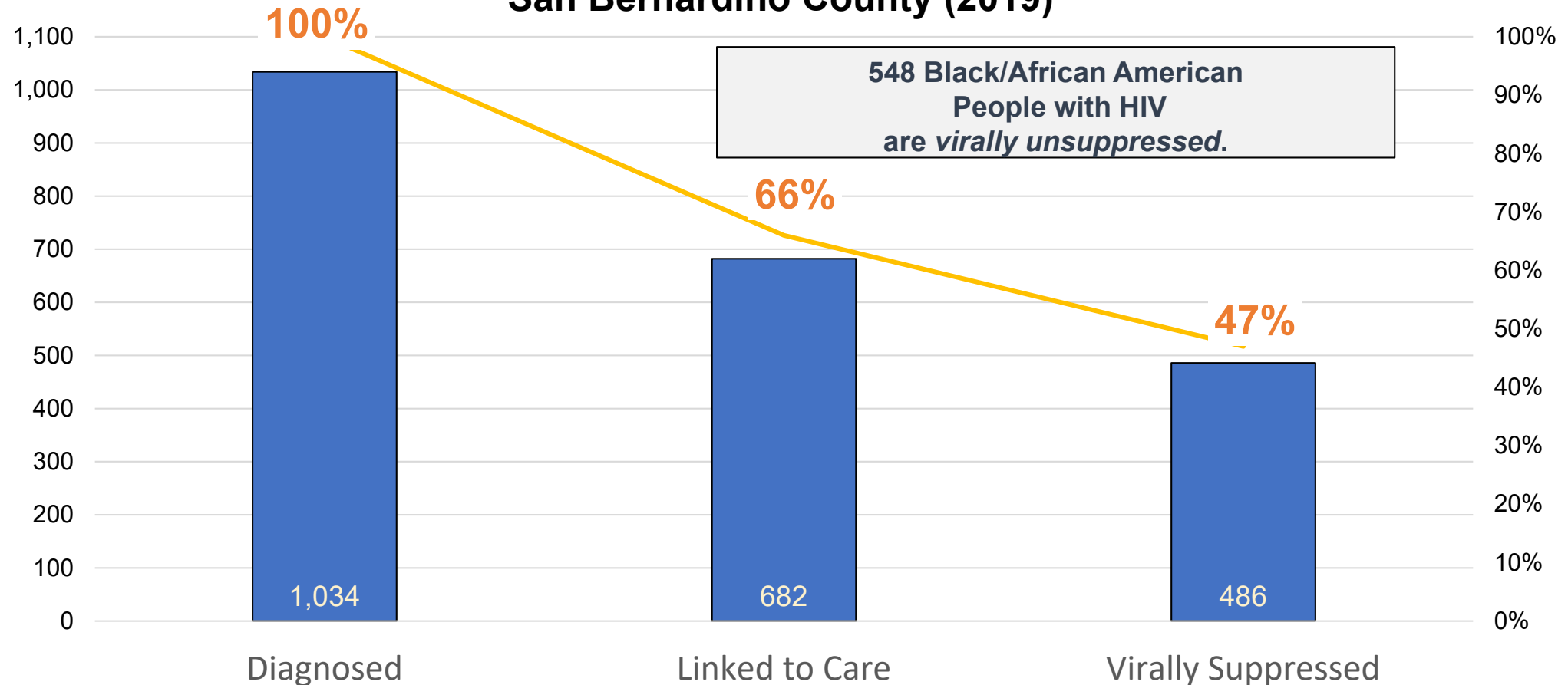


TA Case Study: San Bernardino

 - Workplan review and finalization

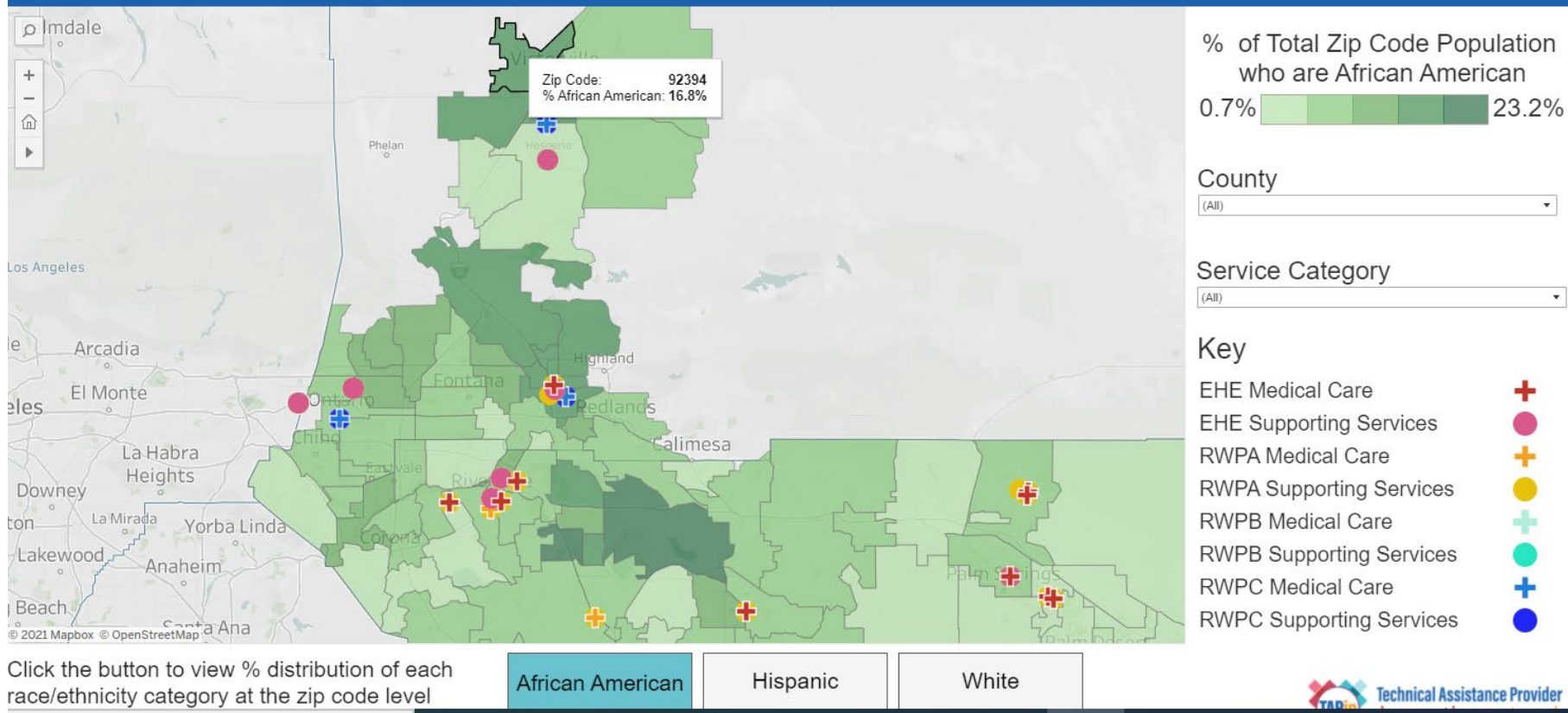
Data Tool: Presenting Priority Population Data to Focus EHE Funding/Strategies

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TAP-in and NASTAD Shared TA: New Orleans Jurisdiction

- **TA Request:** To obtain data to support EHE strategies, including exploring models of data sharing and getting access to prescription data
- **TA Period:** May - October 2021
- **TA Expert Team:** CAI's TAP-in with Mission Analytics

New Orleans: TAP-in TA Activities

Key Activities

Identified best strategies to access surveillance and other data (i.e., pharmacy data) on a more regular basis

Set up peer to peer consultation on data sharing models and lessons learned with Michigan/Detroit

Prepared the jurisdiction to facilitate a conversation on data sharing with the state

TAP-in: Connecting New Orleans with NASTAD

In October 2021, the jurisdiction needed additional support to connect with the state and explore coordination for data sharing agreements

TAP-in looped in NASTAD and shared key questions from the jurisdiction

The TA request was referred to NASTAD with a warm handoff

New Orleans SCP: TA Request on Data Sharing with the State

- New Orleans participated in the EHE RWHAP Part A Data Innovation Consultation. This convening brought together a small group of part A recipients as well as state and local surveillance programs.
- The consultation set the context for new ways that Part A recipients are using and sharing data to implement their EHE work plans and legal and ethical considerations for pursuing new data sharing activities.

New Orleans: SCP-TA Request: Coordination of ART Coverage

- Coordinated the development of a Rapid ART Drug Coverage Protocol with the state AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP).
- Identified a pathway for Rapid ART initiation within eight (8) parishes; Orleans, Jefferson, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, St. Charles, St. James, St. John the Baptist, and St. Tammany.
- Solidified protocol components to include an image of the LA HAP enrollment card, application details including eligibility and enrollment, and participating L-DAP pharmacies for use.
