

SPNS launched the "Dissemination of Evidence-informed Interventions to Improve Health Outcomes along the HIV Care Continuum" Initiative using an implementation science approach to study and produce evidence-informed, replicable, cost-effective, care and treatment interventions

SPNS Featured in National HIV Care Continuum Report

The "Health Information Technology Capacity Building Initiative for Monitoring and Improving Health Outcomes Along the HIV Care Continuum" was highlighted in a national publication. Also featured in the report is the "Addressing HIV Care and Housing Coordination Through Data Integration to Improve Health Outcomes Along the HIV Care Continuum" Initiative that focuses on the integration of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)/Housing Opportunities for People With AIDS (HOPWA) and Ryan White data systems to better assess housing's impact on health outcomes.

Supporting the National HIV/AIDS Strategy

- ▶ Publications on national HIV goals cite demonstration projects as fostering coordination and collaboration across agencies.
- "System Linkages and Access to Care for Populations at High Risk of HIV Infection" Initiative coordinates critical components of federal, state, and local public health systems.
- ► SPNS "System-level Workforce Capacity Building for Integrating HIV Primary Care in Community Healthcare Settings" Initiative was named in a White House Office of National AIDS Policy fact sheet for its contributions toward achieving an AIDS-Free generation.
- ▶ SPNS **"Electronic Networks of Care"** Initiative receives national recognition.
- ► SPNS "Enhancing Access to and Retention in Quality HIV Primary Care for Transgender Women of Color" was included in the HHS LGBTQ Coordinating Committee highlights and the White House consultation on improving outcomes in the transgender community.
- SPNS was recognized in a national operational plan and implementation progress report as well as the HHS implementation progress report for its work on viral hepatitis coinfection, incarceration, homelessness, opioid treatment, leveraging of public health data, building a medical home for multiply diagnosed homeless populations, women of color, and more.
