

## Improving HIV Health Outcomes through the Coordination of Supportive Employment and Housing Services

## DEMONSTRATION SITE

University Health System Bexar County Hospital District | San Antonio, TX

	GEOGRAPHIC LANDSCAPE	All partner agencies are located within a 10-mile radius of downtown San Antonio and are easily accessible via public transportation.
	THE CHALLENGE	A comprehensive needs assessment revealed that a lack of education, employment and stable housing are barriers to client engagement healthcare. Only 10% of clients surveyed reported working full-time while 75% of survey respondents were unemployed, 7% worked part-time and 4% worked part-time while receiving disability.
	FOCUS POPULATION	People living with HIV (PLWH) who are low-income, uninsured/underinsured and unstably housed and live in racial and ethnic minority communities in the four-county Transitional Grant Area (TGA). TGA counties consist of Bexar, Comal, Guadalupe, and Wilson.
Ö <sub>Q</sub>	THE MODEL	We will coordinate client services for six months and transition clients to the TGA's case management system after completion of program. Acuity scores will determine clients' case management paths.
