35	Q&A	<p>Question: Are Affordable Care Act insurance premiums paid by ADAP considered full or partial payments?</p> <p>Answer: ACA insurance premiums paid by ADAP are considered partial payments due to the premium tax credit.</p>	<p>Question: Are Affordable Care Act insurance premiums paid by ADAP considered full or partial payments?</p> <p>Answer: Reporting ACA insurance premiums as partial or full payments depends on whether the client received the Advance Premium Tax Credit (APTC). ACA insurance premiums paid by ADAP are considered <u>partial payments when clients qualify to receive an APTC</u>. ACA insurance premiums paid by ADAP are considered <u>full payments when clients don't qualify to receive an APTC</u></p>
35	Added Q&A		<p>Question: A client initially does not qualify for an APTC until they submit their taxes. The ADAP receives a partial refund for the paid premium upon APTC eligibility. Does the ADAP report the reconciliation for that year?</p> <p>Answer: ADAPs are not required to report reconciliations for the APTC.</p>
39	Added Tip		If a viral load count is undetectable, report the lower bound of the test limit. If the lower bound is not available, report zero.

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39	Added Q&A		<p>Question: Do I report a client's clinical data when it was collected outside the client's enrollment period (but within the reporting period)?</p> <p>Answer: Please report available client clinical data collected during the reporting period even when the tests occurred prior to enrollment or after disenrollment.</p>
