

## Preparing for 2022 ADR Reporting: Updates and Best Practices - Written Q & A Summary

#	Questions	Answers
1.	What is the specific target date for posting the 2022 ADR Instruction Manual?	The 2022 <a href="#">ADR Instruction Manual</a> will be posted before the end of the year. We strongly encourage you to subscribe to the <a href="#">DISQ listserv</a> receive the update once it is released.
2.	What if the number of Med Days a client received was greater than 30 days, such as 31. We have had claims for every possible quantity of Med Days between 30 and 60. Are we not permitted to report the correct number of Med Days if the value is > 30?	For medication days supply, ADAPs should report the actual number of days for which the medication was dispensed. The days supply should not be rounded to 30 day increments.
3.	Should medication costs also exclude PBM admin fees? Additionally, should the medication admin fees get reported the same way that dispense fees are reported?	Medication costs reported in the ADR should only include the cost of the medication, not any dispensing or administrative fees. The cost should also be before any rebates. Definitions for dispensing and administrative costs can be found in the ADR Instruction Manual.
4.	Do you happen to know which CAREWare build added STATENO?	The STATENO feature was first included in build 135.
5.	Will the release of the ADR Schema document be announced via the listserv?	Yes, the updated ADR Schema document is anticipated to be released in January 2023. Please sign up for the <a href="#">DISQ listserv</a> so you can receive an update once it is released.
6.	Are “Application Received Date” and “Application Approved Date” only for new clients? If someone was a client 10 years ago and is now returning, are they considered new?	“Application Received Date” and “Application Approved Date” data elements are only for new clients. A new client is someone who submitted a complete application and was approved for the first time. A client who was previously enrolled in your ADAP, was disenrolled and then returned to your ADAP is not considered new; they would be reported as an existing client.
