

Video Transcript: Sharing What Works

Speaker 1 (00:00): Sharing What Works.

Speaker 1 (00:10): The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Best Practices Compilation. Powered by the HRSA HIV/AIDS Bureau. The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Best Practices Compilation is an online hub for knowledge sharing across the HIV service community. But what does it truly mean to share? Sharing builds capacity and helps everyone grow, especially those working to improve care and services for people with HIV.

Fortunately, the Best Practices Compilation is an easy way to Search, Share, and Nominate success stories from a variety of HIV care and service settings. Meet Elijah. Elijah works at a local Ryan White HIV/AIDS program funded organization that provides core medical and support services to people with HIV in his community. Elijah is always looking for innovative ideas to help improve the way he delivers services to his clients.

So how can Elijah use the Compilation to search for Best Practices that address clients' needs and will work in his program? He can go to TargetHIV.org/bestpractices select Search, and use the Search and Filter tools to help him find what he's looking for. Using the Search tool, Elijah finds a Best Practice approach that interests him.

Description Narrator (01:15): Elijah navigates the TargetHIV webpage to select the JumpstART page. He clicks through the page's various sections, including core elements, outcomes, etc.

Speaker 1 (01:34): He's excited to learn that the Compilation has a detailed success story or profile of that approach. The details include the need that is addressed by the approach, what the core elements are, and the client outcomes that improved as a result of using this approach.

Elijah can also read about considerations for Sustainability, Lessons Learned, and click on Related Resources to support him in implementing this approach at his organization. Elijah decides to share what he found in the Compilation with his team and explore the resources and tools available to help them replicate this new approach at their organization.

Meet Roslyn. Roslyn works at a local Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program funded organization that provides medical and support services to people over 50 years of age with HIV. Roslyn recently led a year-long quality improvement project to increase the number of clients over 50 in the program who were housed and virally suppressed. She shared her success story at a regional meeting. She heard from many other attendees that her approach could be a solution in their programs as well.

Luckily, Roslyn had recently learned about the Best Practices Compilation from her Project Officer and knew it was an online place to share lessons learned with others in the HIV care and services community. So how can Roslyn use the Compilation to share her Best Practice? She can go to TargetHIV.org/bestpractices. Select, Share and complete a brief Online Questionnaire. Much of the information she included in her conference presentation could be used to answer the Questionnaire.

Speaker 1 (03:10): The Compilation team will use the information Roslyn provides to determine if her approach is eligible to be included, and if it is, create a profile of Roslyn's Best Practice to be featured in the Compilation.

Speaker 1 (03:33): Meet Desi. Desi works at a local Ryan White HIV/AIDS program funded organization that provides medical and support services to the Hispanic and Latinx community. Their program has been struggling to reach Hispanic and Latinx men with HIV and engage them in care. After piloting a few different approaches to meet the needs of this community, they are still struggling to find something that's a good fit.

Desi attended a conference and learned about an innovative outreach and engagement approach designed for Hispanic and Latinx men with HIV. They thought other organizations could benefit from this approach. Luckily, Desi had recently learned about the Best Practices Compilation, when they stopped by the Compilation exhibit booth at the same conference.

Speaker 1 (04:24): Desi knew it was an online place to share innovative solutions with others in the HIV care and services community. So how can Desi use the Compilation to nominate the Best Practice? They can go to TargetHIV.org/bestpractices. Select Nominate and answer five short questions.

Speaker 1 (04:51): The Compilation team will contact the nominated organization to see if they would like to be featured in the Compilation.
