



Maternal and Infant Health Mapping Tool

- Interactive online tool for exploring health resources, the geographic relationships between maternal and infant health indicators, and demographics
- Designed to help federal, state and local decisionmakers and others visualize maternal and infant health factors to assist in understanding need and targeting resources



Coming Soon! RWHAP Parts C and D recipients service area delivery sites will be listed on the mapping tool



Why Do We Need This?

Explore county-level maternal and infant health resources Display the geographic relationships between health indicators, resources, demographics, etc. Provide a reference on maternal and infant populations for use when preparing for emergencies and responding to them

Provide context and perspective on maternal and infant health indicators and resources across the country Identify areas with lower and higher rates of maternal and infant health indicators (bright spots and hot spots)

Identify service area gaps and possible areas for additional resources

Help Your Community Stay Healthy This Summer: Encourage Mpox Vaccination

- As the weather heats up and calendars fill up with celebrations and gatherings, HRSA's Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program wants to help your clients and your community stay healthy this summer
- Although the mpox public health emergency has ended last year, risk of renewed mpox outbreaks over the summer months warrants continued vigilance, steps to reduce risk of infections and encourage vaccination, especially among individuals engaging in sex while attending large community gatherings







RWHAP Recipients' Role in Addressing Mpox

- Actions RWHAP recipients can take to support their communities:
 - Remain aware of current mpox vaccination and testing recommendations, particularly for people with HIV who are immunocompromised, as they are more likely to have severe mpox disease

Can Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Funds Be Used to Purchase JYNNEOS?

- Yes, RWHAP funds may be used to purchase vaccines for eligible RWHAP clients, including JYNNEOS, in accordance with HRSA HAB Policy Clarification Notice #16-02 Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Services: Eligible Individuals & Allowable Uses of Funds: https://ryanwhite.hrsa.gov/sites/default/files/ryanwhite/grants/service-category-pcn-16-02-final.pdf
- RWHAP recipients would follow the same purchase and acquisition processes as for other vaccines



Four Pillars of Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S. (EHE)



Diagnose

All people with HIV as early as possible.



Treat

People with HIV rapidly and effectively to reach sustained viral suppression.

Prevent



New HIV transmissions by using using proven interventions, including pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and syringe services programs (SSPs).



Respond

Quickly to potential HIV outbreaks to get needed prevention and treatment services to people who need them.



Diagnosing and Linking People with HIV to Effective Care is Critical for Preventing New Transmissions

HIV Transmissions in the United States, 2016

% of People with HIV	Status of Care	Accounted for X% of New Transmissions ^a	
15%	Didn't know they had HIV	38%	
23%	Knew they had HIV but weren't in care	43%	
11%	In care but not virally suppressed	20%	
51%	Taking HIV medicine and virally suppressed	0%	



Community Engagement and the RWHAP

- Community engagement is part of the existing fabric of the RWHAP.
- RWHAP recipients funded through Parts A, B, C, D, and the EHE are encouraged and/or required to support activities that:
 - Facilitate collaboration with community members
 - Work with their communities and public health partners to improve health outcomes across the HIV care continuum



Why Is Community Engagement Important?

- The voices of people with HIV, their communities, and the greater communities that support people with HIV have been the cornerstone of the Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program (RWHAP) since its passage by Congress in 1990.
- While the RWHAP has successfully provided care, support, and treatment for nearly 567,000 people in 2022, there remains hundreds of thousands of people who have HIV but are not diagnosed or are inconsistently in care.
- With a renewed focus on community engagement to meet the goals for the Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S. (EHE) initiative, HRSA's RWHAP understands our collective success depends on how well communities are involved in the planning, development, and implementation of HIV care and treatment strategies.

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HAB's Community Engagement Guiding Principles and Valuing People with Lived Experience

HRSA's HIV/AIDS Bureau (HAB) understands our collective success depends on how well communities are involved in the *planning, development, and implementation* of HIV care and treatment strategies and supports the following guiding principles: *intentional*, committed, sustainable, flexible and tailored, and transformational.

Additionally, valuing people with lived experience is critical to successful community engagement.

- HAB expects that RWHAP recipients work with people with lived experience and communities in ways that support these guiding principles.
- The framework's purpose is to understand how to achieve and sustain community engagement and ensure that people with lived experience have a role in that effort.
