Primary Care HIV Prevention (PCHP) Funding Objectives



Tests & Counseling

Increase the number of patients counseled and tested for HIV



Linkage to Care

Increase the percentage of patients newly diagnosed with HIV who are linked to care and treatment within 30 days of diagnosis



Prevention

Increase the number of patients prescribed PrEP

Primary Care HIV Prevention (PCHP) Funding

HRSA awards funding to health centers in the 57 EHE geographic jurisdictions to expand prevention services that decrease the risk of HIV transmission - including use of PrEP, testing, outreach, and care coordination.

PCHP Health Centers Progress in Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S.

In 2023, PCHP-Awardees reported:

- Conducting nearly **2.4 million** HIV tests
- Treating more than **146,000** patients living with HIV, including at many sites co-funded by the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program
- Providing over **66,000** patients with Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) services

Overall Health Center Progress in Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S.

In 2023, health centers reported:

- Conducting more than **4 million** HIV tests
- Treating nearly **208,000** patients living with HIV, including at many sites co-funded by the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program
- Providing nearly **83,000** patients with Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) services

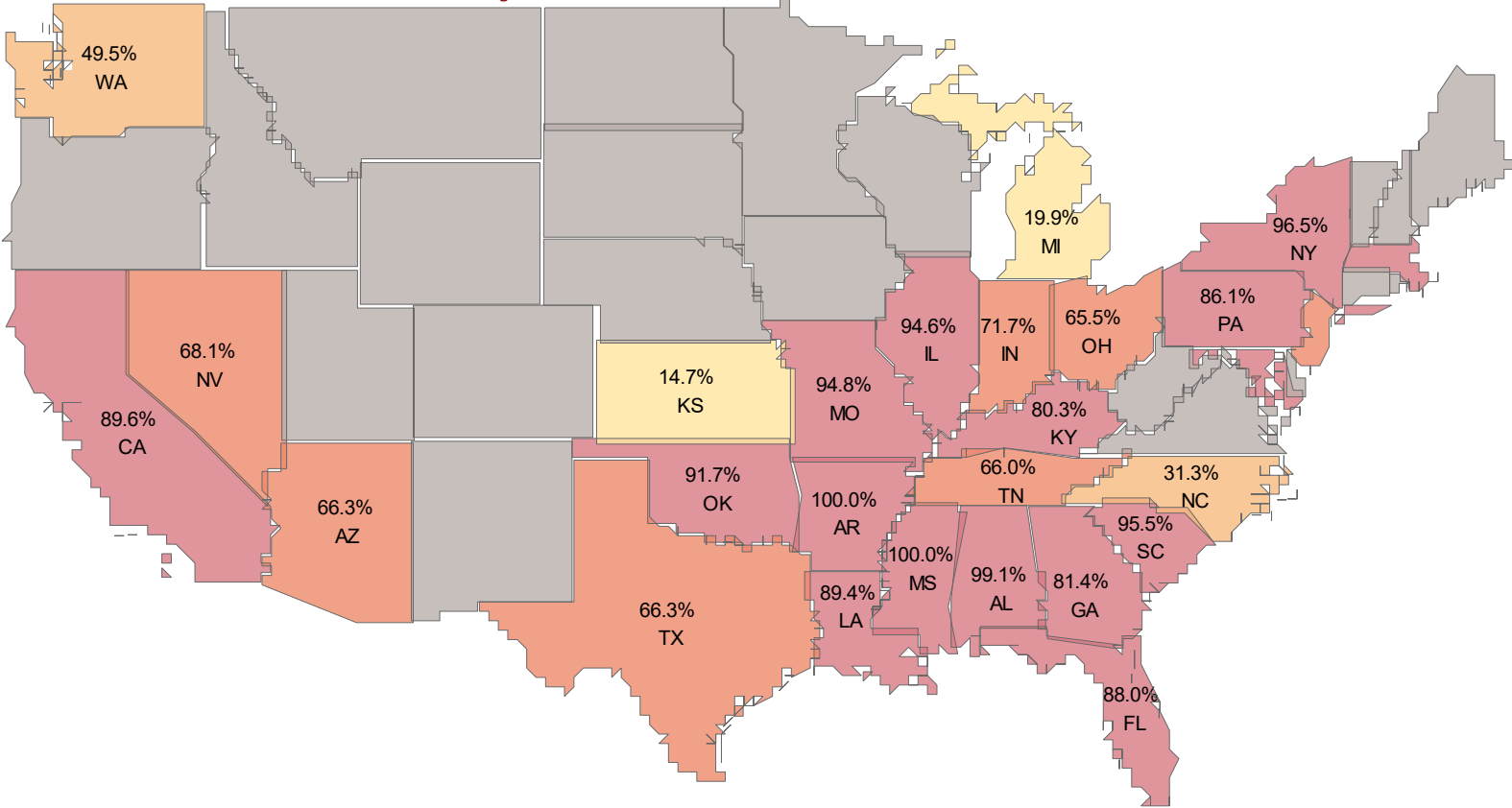

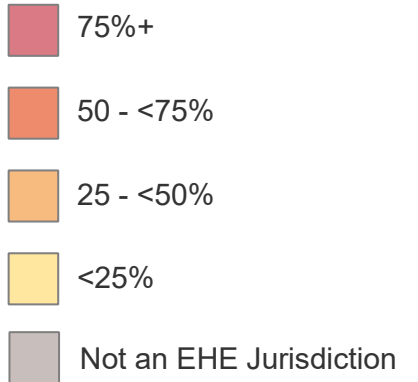
2023 Health Center Program Impact – PrEP Services (1/2)
