Link and Phelan Stigmatization Model

Bruce Link and Jo Phelan propose that stigma exists with four specific components;

Necessity of Power -affects access to social, economic, and political power that allows:

- The identified differences (Differentiation and Labeling)

 Identifying differences-Black/White, Homosexual/Heterosexual, Young/Old
- The construction of stereotypes (Stereotype)

 The process of linking labeled differences to an individual or group, which can be used to deny individuals respect or legitimacy.
- The separation of labeled persons into groups (Us and Them)

 The linking of negative attributes to different groups of individuals facilitates a sense of separation between "us" and "them."
- The full execution of disapproval (Disadvantage)

 Life Chances (Income, education, mental well-being, housing status, health, and medical treatment.)

Stigma affects power by means of rejection, exclusion, and discrimination.
