- Established Centralized Eligibility System
- PrEP Drug Assistance Program




Benefits of an In-House Medical Benefits Program

- Policies and Procedures





 - Claims Lead
 - Contracts and recruits Providers
 - Determines benefits
 - Dispute resolution
- Claims Processor
 - Adjudicates claims
 - Manages claim organization
- Administrative Assistant
 - Opens and stamps incoming claims
