### **HIV/AIDS** Bureau Vision and Mission

#### Vision

Optimal HIV/AIDS care and treatment for all.

#### Mission

Provide leadership and resources to assure access to and retention in high quality, integrated care, and treatment services for vulnerable people living with HIV/AIDS and their families.





## **HIV/AIDS Bureau Priorities**

- NHAS 2020/PEPFAR 3.0 Maximize HRSA HAB expertise and resources to operationalize NHAS 2020 and PEPFAR 3.0
- **Leadership** Enhance and lead national and international HIV care and treatment through evidence-informed innovations, policy development, health workforce development, and program implementation
- Partnerships Enhance and develop strategic domestic and international partnerships internally and externally
- Integration Integrate HIV prevention, care, and treatment in an evolving healthcare environment
- Data Utilization Use data from program reporting systems, surveillance, modeling, and other programs, as well as results from evaluation and special projects efforts to target, prioritize, and improve policies, programs, and service delivery
- Operations Strengthen HAB administrative and programmatic processes through Bureau-wide knowledge management, innovation, and collaboration

## The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program

- The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program (RWHAP) provides a comprehensive system of care through HIV specialty care, primary care, and support services for low-income people living with HIV (PLWH)
  - RWHAP works with cities, states and local community-based organizations to reach over 500,000 people living with HIV
  - RWHAP funds technical assistance, clinical training, and the development of innovative models of care
- The RWHAP is funded at \$2.32 billion in fiscal year 2016

## PLWH Public Leadership & Health Outcomes

- Ensuring that people living with HIV (PLWH) are engaged in public leadership will help achieve the primary goals of the National HIV/AIDS Strategy and maximize health outcomes of PLWH as they move through the HIV care continuum towards viral suppression.
- It is a HIV/AIDS Bureau (HAB) 2016 priority to enhance national and international PLWH leadership.
- How best to enhance leadership was the focus of an expert panel consultation.

#### **RWHAP Outcome Data**

# Substantial progress has been made, but HIV outcomes data for RWHAP clients highlight areas requiring more attention including:

- Viral Suppression- Increased from 69.5% to 81.4%
  - Unstable Housing, 15-34 year olds, Transgender are 5 % to 17% below average
- PLWH public leadership can help improve HIV outcomes



## **Developing Leadership Among PLWH**

#### People of Color Living with HIV Leadership and Training

- Secretary's Minority AIDS Initiative Fund (SMAIF) project
- PLWH leadership and planning training
- Develop tools to enable PLWH to participate on planning bodies, care teams, organizations, boards of directors, etc.

#### People Living with HIV Public Leadership Consultation

- Identify existing strategies that promote public leadership of PLWH
- Address barriers and gaps in public leadership development of PLWH
- Explore strategies to close these gaps



- Held May 18th, 2016
- Convened 15 expert panelists with diverse backgrounds, experiences, and expertise, most of whom are PLWH and all of whom are public leaders

### **Gaps and Barriers**

- PLWH have wide ranging expertise through education and/or life experience often not acknowledged, tapped or leveraged
- Ongoing obstacles of discrimination, stigmatization, bias, power and privilege differentials, inattention to social justice and human rights
- Youth leadership hindered by lack of opportunity in top positions and strong protocols for safe and productive mentorships
- Inadequate services for transgender population

### **Promising Strategies**

- Mentoring and peer programming
- Creating opportunities for continuing education and training
- Participatory program development
- Placement in senior and mid-level management positions
- Prioritizing, conducting, and publishing research
- Increasing and expanding policy and advocacy activity

### **Prioritized Ideas from Experts**

- Expanding definition of "consumer" to include PLWH who may not need RWHAP services, but have important experience and expertise to contribute
- Integrating peer training, "train the trainers," and mentoring into existing programs and events.
- Hosting in-person conferences with skill-building tracts, along with financial assistance.
- Developing public-private partnerships to assist in financial longitudinal programming.
- Funding evidence-based, successful programs.

- Women of color
- Transgender
- Youth
- Native American

- Engaging consumers and clients as advisors for improving Ryan White services
- Using input from this consultation to develop and distribute a public leadership survey to a larger cross-section of PLWH to gather more input and validate information from this meeting.
- Developing partnerships to integrate HIV and transgender-related care services
