- Public health approach to providing a comprehensive system of care
- Ensure low-income people living with HIV (PLWH) receive optimal care and treatment

Purpose of RWHAP, cont.

- **The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program (RWHAP) provides a comprehensive system of care through HIV primary care, specialty care, and support services for low-income people living with HIV (PLWH)**
 - RWHAP works with cities, states and local community-based organizations to provide services to over 500,000 people living with HIV
 - RWHAP funds technical assistance, clinical training, and the development of innovative models of care
- **The RWHAP was funded at \$2.32 billion in fiscal year 2016**

HIV/AIDS Program PrEP Letter Released on June 22, 2016

- **Recognizes the importance of PrEP**
- **Acknowledges role of RWHAP system of care and services**
- **Confirms HIV/AIDS Bureau support of RWHAP recipients' exploring ways to use expertise and infrastructure to support PrEP**

RWHAP Unallowable Costs Related to PrEP

- RWHAP funding cannot be used to pay for PrEP medications or the related medical services for HIV-negative clients who are at substantial risk for HIV
 - These unallowable costs also apply to program income and rebates

How the RWHAP can Support PrEP


- Building PrEP services or programs on existing RWHAP systems, services, programs, personnel, and expertise (leveraging what has been built over the past 25 years)
- Using components of a few service categories specifically related to:
 - HIV testing and referral
 - Psychosocial support for affected family members
 - Risk reduction education for partners of people living with HIV

Examples of RWHAP Existing Systems

- **RWHAP AIDS Drug Assistance Program**
- **Clinical systems**
- **Case management systems**
- **HIV program support systems**
- **Clinical expertise and training**

RWHAP AIDS Education and Training Centers and PrEP

- Provide training to primary care providers on PrEP
- Provide a *PrEPLine for providers (funded by CDC)

*Policy Clarification Notice (PCN) #16-02
Replaces Policy #10-02*

Scope of Coverage: Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program (RWHAP) Parts A, B, C, and D, and Part F where funding supports direct care and treatment services.

Purpose of PCN

This policy clarification notice replaces the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) PCN 10-02: Eligible Individuals & Allowable Uses of Funds for Discretely Defined Categories of Services regarding eligible individuals and the description of allowable service categories for Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program and program guidance for implementation.

Background

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has consolidated, in 2 CFR Part 200, the uniform grants administrative requirements, cost principles, and audit requirements for all organization types (state and local governments, non-profit and educational institutions, and hospitals) receiving federal awards. These requirements, known as the "Uniform Guidance," are applicable to recipients and subrecipients of federal funds. The OMB Uniform Guidance has been codified by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) in [45 CFR Part 75—Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for HHS Awards](#). RWHAP grant and cooperative agreement recipients and subrecipients should be thoroughly familiar with 45 CFR Part 75. Recipients are required to monitor the activities of the subrecipient to ensure the subaward is used for authorized purposes in compliance with applicable statute, regulations, policies and the terms and conditions of the award (see [45 CFR §§ 75.351-352](#)).
