




Broad support for people living with HIV to remain engaged in comprehensive care, including support for treatment adherence.













### **Federal Action Plan**


- Reducing New Infections:
- HRSA and CDC will develop and deliver TA, trainings, and information to HRSA programs on PrEP and PEP implementations strategies.
- Improving Access to Care & Health Outcomes:
- HRSA will provide TA on Data to Care by developing a learning collaborative across Ryan White jurisdictions to share models for addressing gaps along the care continuum.
- **OPA, CDC, HRSA** will provide trainings for HHS award recipients to incorporate family planning as part of comprehensive HIV, mental health, substance use treatment delivery.





### **Federal Action Plan Continued**

- Reducing Disparities:
- HRSA and CDC will promote development of public leadership skills by including PLHIV in integrated prevention/care planning.
- Achieving Greater Coordination:
- HRSA and HUD will identify models for integrating housing and HIV care data systems to enhance coordination of service delivery.
- HRSA will develop tools to help award recipients measure progress toward performance goals.

#### **EXAMPLES OF ACTIONS FOR STAKEHOLDERS**

Community-based organizations cam:

- Determine effective ways that HIV testing services can be marketed to populations at highest risk, and take steps to allocate resources accordingly.
- Provide inhage to PrEP services for persons at substantial risk for HIV infection.

#### Advocacy groups can:



### Reaching the Goals


- As a guiding document, the Strategy is a National plan, not just a Federal plan.

- Everyone is needed to put this Strategy into action and end the HIV epidemic.









## 1.2 Million People Living with HIV
